



## 2003 AMA GRAND NATIONAL ENDURO CHAMPIONSHIP SUPPLEMENTAL RULES

All rules set forth in the 2003 AMA Sports Rules governing Pro Am, Standard, ATV and Youth Competition will govern these events unless set forth in these supplementals.

### NATIONAL CLASSES:

1. The following are the classes in which National Enduro points will be paid:
  1. Overall (AA, A & B riders riding the same course)
  2. 86-200cc "A"
  3. 201-250cc "A"
  4. 251-Open "A"
  5. Veteran (30 yrs. & Up) "A"
  6. Senior (40 yrs. & Up) "A"
  7. Super Senior (50 yrs. & Up) "A" & "B" combined
  8. 4-Stroke (86cc-Open) "A"
  9. 86-200cc "B"
  10. 201-250cc "B"
  11. 251-Open "B"
  12. Veteran (30 yrs. & Up) "B"
  13. Senior (40 yrs. & Up) "B"
  14. 4-Stroke (86cc-Open) "B"
  15. Women's "A" & "B" combined
  16. Masters 60+"A" & "B" combined
2. **It is the rider's responsibility to enter the proper class. Failure to do so will result in the loss of all points earned. All riders who ride the "A" class locally, must enter the "A" class nationally.**

### NATIONAL AND GRAND NATIONAL POINTS:

1. In order to be eligible for Grand National/National points, a rider must earn points in at least two (2) National events in the same class. Grand National points and National class points will be based on the following points schedule:

Example: At a series event a rider may finish first in the 250cc class and third overall. He would receive 30 points for his 250cc class win and 21 points toward the Grand National Championship. Class points and overall "A" points shall be kept separately by the AMA.

2. The AMA/FMF Racing National Enduro Overall Champion will be decided by the points accumulated at all of the rounds on the AMA/FMF Racing National Enduro series schedule. Class champions will be decided by 3 less than the total number of events held in the series. Ties are broken by comparing the number of first, second, third, etc. finishes, until the ties are resolved.

## **RACE RULES:**

1. The minimum mileage for a National Enduro is 85 **actual ground** mileage.
2. At Nationals, all AA riders start one minute apart, beginning with the previous years champion at row 21, 2nd on row 22 and continuing on until all AA competitors have started, including riders electing to ride the AA class that were not in the top 15 overall the previous year.
3. National Championship Enduros must have an advance entry closing date no less than 7 days before the meet.
4. All "A" riders are accepted up to the closing date. The balance of the field is to be made up of the earliest additional entries received.
5. "B" riders entering the "A" class at a National Enduro immediately advance to "A" class.
6. Markers used at Nationals must be approved by the AMA
7. At National Enduros, speed changes are recommended but not required.
8. Promoters of National Enduros must perform a sound test. As stated in the standard rules for Enduros, organizers must have additional tech inspections during the run (location unknown to riders) including a sound test. Machines that do not meet sound requirements will be disqualified. Failure to do so will result in cancellation of the organization's application for a National the next year.
9. If any error in flip cards is discovered at a National Enduro checkpoint, the check reverts to observation status.
